"Stories are so much more **powerful** when they are shared by the people that they happened to."

"I was aware of prejudice going on, but it was **good to hear from other people** from other faiths how they feel."

"I was able to understand that situations are **not as straight forward** as they seem."

"Started thinking about where the **tipping point** is from seeing someone as a **victim** to seeing them as a **perpetrator.**"

What was found most beneficial: "thinking about our **own bias**", "hearing **other people's experiences**", "talking **openly about prejudice** and how it affects those young people in our own settings", "being able to **discuss uncomfortable issues** openly"
